### OCF MARCH 2021 REPORT (DIRECTOR COLLIER-MONTGOMERY)

The OCF continues to operate under a modified status. All services are being provided remotely via email and telephone (202-671-0547). All candidate and committee reports will continue to be received online at the OCF website by the required deadlines. Candidates and committees may also contact the office for instructions concerning the registration process.

The Hearing on the Fiscal Year 2020 Performance Report and the Fiscal Year 2021 Performance Plan of the OCF was held on February 18, 2021 before the Committee on the Judiciary & Public Safety of the Council of the District of Columbia.

#### • Fair Elections Program Division (FEP)

- Authorized Base Amount and Matching Payments
  - As of March 31, 2021, the total sum of \$4,016,797.64 has been disbursed from the Fair Elections Fund (Base Amount Payments: \$1,120,000; Matching Payments: \$2,896,797.64) to the 36 candidates certified in the FEP to participate in the June 2, 2020 Primary Election ("the Primary Election"), the June 16, 2020 Special Election ("the Special Election"), and the November 3, 2020 General Election ("the General Election").
  - During March 2021, there were no disbursements authorized for Base Amount and Matching Payments from the Fair Elections Fund.

# BOE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MARCH 2021 REPORT (EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MILLER)

#### • General Information

- o Correspondence has been mailed to voters, in-state and out-of-state, whose ballots were undeliverable during the 2020 General Election.
- The agency is receiving responses to this correspondence from voters, which will allow the Board to update registration information, including removing voters from the registry.
- There were 52,000 mail ballot envelopes marked as undeliverable and returned to the agency.
- The Board has received 10,286 canvass cards after conducting a second canvass mailing to voters.
- During the General Election, 101,968 voters who were mailed ballots elected not to vote. Notifications have been mailed to those individuals requesting confirmation of their voter information.
- The canvass process involves multiple mailers, one which cannot be forwardable, and another that can be. The first canvass process returned 5,271 cards, which are currently being processed.
- If a current resident receives a canvass card for someone that does not live there, the Board requests that the card be filled out to so indicate and returned so that voter information can be updated.
- O In March, the Council introduced emergency legislation, signed by the Mayor, that requires the Board to support the vacancy filling process for SMD's within the ANC in conjunction with the Office of the ANC Commissioner. The Board will conduct those elections during the regularly scheduled ANC meetings until the public state of emergency is over.
- The Board has published notices regarding the vacancies in three SMD'S with vacancies: 4A05, 7F07, 8E03.
- Due to the Department of Corrections (DOC) sitting within SMD 7F07, the new legislation has specific directives for this SMD, since access to DOC cannot be obtained during a public health emergency.
- On April 9, 2021, vacancy notifications were posted on the Board's website.
  Nominating petitions may be circulated for 21 days, from April 12, 2021 through May 3, 2021.
- The ANC vacancy challenge period will run from May 6, 2021 through May 12, 2021.

- The Board is currently developing educational videos for various populations, including returning citizens and incarcerated residents, regarding information about the voting and election process.
- Last month, the state director of the Maryland Board of Elections toured the Board's warehouse to observe the operation process of the Agilis mail ballot sorting equipment from the General Election.

## **BOE OGC MARCH 2021 REPORT (GENERAL COUNSEL STROUD)**

- Rulemaking
  - Emergency and Proposed Rulemaking
    - To place the Board's regulations into conformity with the newly amended Initiative and Referendum Process Improvement Act of 2020, which became effective on March 16, 2021.
    - Pursuant to this rulemaking, adjustments will be made to the Board's regulations to reflect the legislation. The new legislation will require the Board to draft a summary statement written in plain language, request a fiscal impact statement from the Office of the Chief Financial Officer, to request advisory opinions within a defined timeframe from the Attorney General and General Counsel of the Council, to publish formulations adopted at a public meeting in the D.C. Register and at least one newspaper of circulation, and to publish the measure on the Board's website.
      - Request approval for changes to be sent to the D.C. Register for publication and be effective in emergency and proposed form.
        - ➤ **BOARD ACTION:** Unanimously approved motion to transmit rulemaking to the Office of Documents and Administrative Issuances for publication in the D.C. Register.
