DCBOE representatives will also register high school seniors at Duke Ellington School of the Arts, Phelps High School, Coolidge High School, and Perry Street Preparatory Charter School.

Started in 2012 for the presidential election, National Voter Registration Day is designed to create an annual moment when the entire nation focuses on registering Americans to exercise their most basic right—the right to vote. Since 2012, more than 356,000 Americans have registered to vote.
