New location announced and scheduled to open in January 2018

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The District of Columbia Board of Elections (DCBOE) today announces that after 25 years of operations at One Judiciary Square, it will soon move to a new home at 1015 Half Street SE.

“441 4th Street has served DCBOE and District of Columbia voters well for the last 25 years, but it’s time for a facelift,” said DCBOE Board Chairman Michael Bennett. “Our new headquarters at 1015 Half Street SE provides the needed upgrades to continue to enfranchise eligible residents, conduct elections, and assure the integrity of the electoral process with efficiency and professionalism.”

1015 Half Street SE is Metro-accessible, located approximately one block from the Navy Yard Metro Station on the Green Line (M Street SE exit).
