CHAIR THOMPSON: All right. We are
recording. We have a court reporter. Good
morning. My name is Gary Thompson, the Chair of
the D.C. Board of Elections and with me is Karyn
Greenfield, my fellow Board member. We have a
quorum. We distributed an agenda and I would
move we adopt that agenda.
MEMBER GREENFIELD: I second.
CHAIR THOMPSON: All in favor.
(Chorus of aye.)
CHAIR THOMPSON: And with that, I'll
turn things over to General Counsel, Terri
Stroud.
MS. STROUD: Okay, we have one item
on our agenda for this Special Board Meeting
which is a challenge to the nominating petition
submitted by Doc Adams. The challenge was filed
by Brian Strege and the office that issued is the
office to fill the vacancy in the Office of Ward
8 Member of the Council for the July 15, 2025,

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special election.

2	We will have the parties state their	
3	names and addresses for the record. I believe I	
4	see Mr. Strege. I hope I'm pronouncing your name	
5	right, but I probably am not. But if you could	
6	state your name and address for the record.	
7	MR. STREGE: Yes, sure. Can you hear	
8	me? Have I been unmuted?	
9	MS. STROUD: Yes.	
10	MR. STREGE: My name is Brian Strege	
11	and my address is 880 New Jersey Avenue SE, Unit	
12	228, Washington, D.C. 20003. That is in Ward 8.	
13	MS. STROUD: Thank you. And we will	
14	have the representatives from the Board of	
15	Elections state their names and work addresses	
16	for the record.	
17	It appears that candidate Doc Adams	
18	is not present, but Section 403.4 of Title 3 of	
19	the D.C. Municipal Regulations permits the Board	
20	to proceed ex parte in the event that a party is	
21	not present. And we have contacted Candidate	
22	Adams to see if he was available to appear and

 General Counsel state for the record the means by
 which the candidate was provided notice of the
 meeting, including reading into the record any
 documents that were sent to inform him of today's
 proceeding.

7 MR. OUINTANA: Council members of the 8 Board, the candidate and the challenger both received email notifications of the pre-hearing 9 10 conference. The candidate was present at the 11 pre-hearing conference. We had exchanged emails 12 at the pre-hearing conference on the 13th earlier 13 this week. Both parties were informed of the 14 date and time of this hearing, that it would be 15 today at 9:30 and then on the 14th, both of them, 16 both parties were emailed the actual notice that 17 we publish on our website, along the body of the 18 email and informed them of the date and time, as 19 copied-and-pasted Zoom well as the loqin 20 I have not heard from the candidate information. 21 since.

MS. STROUD: Okay, so what I would

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1	like to do at this time is have the Board move to	
2	proceed ex parte by a roll call vote. So if we	
3	could entertain a motion to proceed ex parte.	
4	CHAIR THOMPSON: Chair, so moves.	
5	MEMBER GREENFIELD: Second.	
б	MS. STROUD: Okay, Chairman Thompson?	
7	CHAIR THOMPSON: Aye.	
8	MS. STROUD: Member Greenfield?	
9	MEMBER GREENFIELD: Aye.	
10	MS. STROUD: Okay, with that, the	
11	Board has moved to proceed ex parte by a roll	
12	call vote. So we'll have the member of the Board	
13	staff, beginning with the Registrar of Voters and

17	MS. CORRENTE: Certainly, good	
18	morning. Thank you. My name is Marissa	
19	Corrente. I'm the Registrar of Voters here at	
20	the D.C. Board of Elections and the address here	
21	is 1015 Half Street SE. We're in Suite 750.	
22	MR. QUINTANA: And my name is Jorge	

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of the D.C. Council. The minimum requirement to obtain ballot access for this office is 500 signatures. The petition contains signatures. Neal R. Gross and Co., Inc. Washington DC

3 Street. 4 MS. STROUD: Okay. So what we're 5 going to do is we're going to have the Registrar 6 of Voters read the summary of her report 7 regarding the challenge into the record and then 8 the parties will have the opportunity to respond. 9 And so with that, we'll hear from the Registrar 10 of Voters. 11 MS. CORRENTE: Thank you. So this 12 memo was sent to all parties on May 9th, 2025. 13 The subject is challenge to the petition of Doc Adams, candidate for Ward 8 member of the D.C. 14 15 17th, 2025, Doc Council. On April Adams

submitted a nominating petition to appear on the

Special Election for the Office of Ward 8 member

ballot as a candidate in the July 15th, 2025

Quintana. I'm an attorney advisor for the Board 2 of Elections at that same address, 1015 Half

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1 The petition was posted for public 2 inspection for ten days as required by law. The petition was challenged on April 28th, 2025, by 3 4 Brian Strege, a registered voter in the District 5 of Columbia. Challenger Stege filed challenges 6 to 439 of the 705 signatures submitted and 7 enumerated by line and page number on individual 8 challenge sheets for each petition page. 9 The signatures challenged are 10 pursuant to the Board's regulations in Title 3, 11 Chapter 16 of the DCMR on the following grounds: 12 The signer, according to the Board's record is 13 not registered to vote at the address listed on 14 the petition at the time the petition was signed; 15 duplicate the signature is а of а valid 16 signature; the petition does not include the 17 address of the signer; the petition does not 18 include the name of the signer and the signature 19 is not sufficiently legible for identification; 20 the signature is not made by the person whose 21 signature it purports to be; and the signer is 2.2 not a registered voter in the ward from which a

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candidate seeks nomination at the time the
 petition was signed.

3 Additionally, the challenger also highlighted blank signature lines throughout the 4 5 petition on the challenge sheet. My review of the challenges indicates that 422 of the 439 6 7 challenges are valid, 122 are valid because the 8 signer is not registered to vote, 162 are valid 9 because the signer is not registered to vote at the address listed on the petition at the time 10 11 the petition was signed, 58 are valid because the 12 signer's voter registration was designated as 13 inactive on the voter roll at the time the 14 petition was signed, one is valid because the 15 signature is a duplicate of a valid signature, 16 four are valid because the signature does not 17 include the address of the signer, 44 are valid 18 because neither the name of the signer nor the 19 sufficiently leqible signature for are 20 identification, and 31 are valid because the 21 signer is not registered voter in the а 2.2 jurisdiction from which the candidate seeks

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1 nomination at the time the petition was signed. 2 This leaves the candidate's nominating petition with 283 signatures, 217 signatures below the 3 4 required number for valid access. 5 And we'll have the next, 6 representative from the Office of the General 7 Counsel discuss what happened at the pre-hearing 8 conference that was held in this matter. 9 I can't hear Jorge. MR. STREGE: 10 MEMBER GREENFIELD: Can't hear him. 11 MR. QUINTANA: Gotcha. At the pre-hearing conference, both parties appeared at 12 13 the correct time. The Assistant Registrar 14 Millicent Green-Wright read the Registrar's Report. The challenger agreed with the findings. 15 16 The candidate objected to the findings. He argued that the National Voting Rights Act -- and he 17 18 just kept repeating 42 U.S.C. 1973gg, put the 19 burden on the Board of Elections to correct the 20 addresses of the signers of his petition. He 21 argued that we should have given them notice and 2.2 that they should have had until 21 days before

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1	the election to correct their signatures. That	
2	was the main point of his argument.	
3	He was informed at the time that even	
4	if we gave him credit for all 162 of those	
5	signatures, that is everyone whose address was	
6	registered at a different address in the same	
7	jurisdiction, it would only bring him up to 445	
8	signatures, still leaving him 55 short of the	
9	required 500. Nonetheless, he wanted to proceed	
10	to a Board hearing.	
11	MS. STROUD: Thank you. So it	
12	appears based on the Registrar's finding that the	
13	candidate is below the minimum number of	
14	signatures required for ballot access by 217	
15	signatures. At this time, we'll hear from the	
16	challenger.	
17	MR. STREGE: I have nothing to add to	
18	the Registrar's Report. And yeah, that's also	
19	pretty much what happened at the pre-hearing, so	
20	I have nothing to add.	
21	MS. STROUD: Thank you. We have	
22	another individual that has logged into the	

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1	meeting and I just want to determine whether or
2	not the individual is Doc Adams. Oh, that's not.
3	Okay. Okay, so based upon the report of the
4	Registrar of Voters and there being no basis upon
5	which to find that the petition has the minimum
6	number required for ballot access, it would be
7	the recommendation of the Office of General
8	Counsel that the challenge be upheld and that the
9	candidate be denied ballot access. And so at
10	this time, if the Board has a motion regarding
11	whether or not or if you have any questions
12	for parties, we can discuss at this time.
13	CHAIR THOMPSON: Yes, the Chair so
14	moves to uphold the challenge and deny the
15	candidate ballot access.
16	MS. STROUD: Okay.
17	MEMBER GREENFIELD: I second.
18	MS. STROUD: Okay, so we'll take a
19	roll call vote.
20	Mr. Chair?
21	CHAIR THOMPSON: Aye.
22	MS. STROUD: Member Greenfield?

1	MEMBER GREENFIELD: Aye.	
2	MS. STROUD: And with that, the Board	
3	moves to uphold the challenge filed by Brian	
4	Strege to the nominating petition submitted by	
5	Doc Adams in support of his candidacy to fill the	
6	vacancy in the Office of Ward 8 member of the	
7	Council in the July 15, 2025, election. That	
8	means that the candidate, Doc Adams, will not	
9	appear on the ballot in the election at issue.	
10	And with that, we have nothing further before the	
11	Board.	
12	CHAIR THOMPSON: Okay, well, thank	
13	you so much, everybody. And I hope everybody has	
13 14	you so much, everybody. And I hope everybody has a great day and with that, I move that we
